

Delivery Options

In person pick up: My favorite as it is really nice to finally get to meet you!!

Local Folks: I will pick a spot for us to meet to deliver your puppy.

Not-so-local folks: I will drive one hour in your direction to help shorten your drive by 2 hours and meet you at the location of my choice.

**Please note – puppies are very prone to get car sick. I do not recommend more than a 3–4-hour drive. It is already stressful enough for them to change their environment. If you are further then a 4-hour drive, I would recommend using a Pet Nanny.

Delivery via Nanny:

We have several Nannies that we exclusively work with. They can fly your pup to your closest MAJOR airport. Their fee is typically \$450-\$550 within the US, depending on number of flights, distance, and if it is nonstop or not. Payment is between you and the Nanny. You will pay them directly - discreetly, in cash at pick up.

Things you should know about Pet Nannies prior to booking:

- Once you pick your pup, if you chose to use a Nanny you must let me know ASAP by filling out the form on the website, what your preferred delivery date and major airport is. They book up FAST.
- Once I have that info, I will contact them to get availability and fee.
- They only fly standby. Flying standby means they **do not** have a confirmed seat and it is possible that once they get to the airport,

they may not be able to get on the flight they had planned on. This rarely happens, but you should know it could happen. If it does, they will try for the next flight.

- I will start a group text a couple of days before delivery to confirm everything. We will all be in contact throughout the day of delivery. I will text once we leave for the airport, and again once the pup is with the Nanny. The Nanny will let us know in the text once they get their seat and are on their way to you. We ask that you track the flight and BE ON TIME to pick up the pup. Nannies are on a tight schedule and try to get on the next flight out to head to their next destination. If you cause them to miss their flight you could be charged extra so, please be on time.
- Once the Nanny and your pup touch ground they will text and let you know exactly where to meet. It's usually in the Baggage Claim area.

Please keep in mind that we can't control the weather, number of flights/seats open, flight delays, etc. Please be understanding if the Nanny can't take the flight that we originally planned for and be flexible. If your life can't allow last-minute changes/flexibility, there are Nanny's who will charge for their time and you would have to pay for a confirmed seat.

Anyone who is driving or flying to get their pup, don't forget to bring a bottle of water and baby wipes/paper towels/small bag for garbage in case they soil themselves. If you will be at the airport DO NOT take the puppy to any doggy areas where they can catch a disease. Take them in a family restroom, lock the door, put down a pee pad and let the pup do its business. If you plan to hold the pup in your lap on the drive home, I would lay a towel in your lap in case the pup gets car sick.
